The 111th stated meeting of The Presbytery of Tres Rios, Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) was called to order by Moderator Matt Miles with prayer at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, February 23, 2018 in the Robert Young Centre of First Presbyterian Church, El Paso. As per our Bylaws, Article X (four ministers and four ruling elder commissioners from four different congregations), a quorum was declared present by Stated Clerk Kay Long. Meeting began with the Call to Worship, celebration of the Lord's Supper and the reading of the Necrology (See Exhibit A). Tracy Spencer-Brown preached the sermon.

Neal Locke welcomed the presbytery to First Presbyterian Church. Special guests and first time commissioners were introduced.

Frances Carlton presented the report of the Synod of the Sun Commissioner which was received as information. On August 26, 2018 "Synod Sunday" will be celebrated. Imagine Mission Connection Conference will be held November 2-3, 2018 in Oklahoma City, OK. Thomas Riggs has been named Communications and Administration Coordinator for the Synod of the Sun.

Valerie Young brought greetings from the Synod of the Sun.

The floor was opened for nominations. Hearing none it was MOVED AND CARRIED that Recommendation III.D be approved.

Report of Missional Outreach Team

The report was presented by Jim Miles that was received as information.

- I. Matters of Information
- A. Jim Miles was elected moderator for the team for 2018. Theresa Wright will serve as clerk.
- B. Team continues to work toward formalizing a Covenant Relationship with Iglesia Presbiteriana-Reformada en Cuba.
- C. During the October 27, 2017 meeting of presbytery a total of 22 PDA Cleanup Buckets and 300 Hygiene Kits were assembled. On November 15, 2017 Matt Miles delivered a total of 78 Cleanup Buckets (22 assembled at presbytery meeting, 40 assembled by University, El Paso and 16 assembled by Grace, Midland) to First Presbyterian Church in Rockport, Texas. The 300 Hygiene kits will be taken to the TRYC Youth Retreat and added to the kits that are prepared during the retreat. They will then be delivered to FernCliff for distribution by PDA.
- D. Judy Sage (FPC, Seminole) and Becky Thomas (FPC, Odessa) were appointed to the St Andrews Mission Board for 2018.

Report of the Administrative Commission for Divine Savior/St Andrew

The report was presented by Jimmy Stevens and received as information.

Since Jayne Ruiz accepted another call in June 2017, these churches have been without an ordained pastor. However, the churches have responded as has the Missional Ministries team. The following summarizes activities over the last several months:

- Rev Lucretia Chew has been appointed Moderator of both churches and has met several times with each session.
- Preaching at St Andrew has been done by three of the elders with communion
 officiated monthly by Debra Clugy-Soto or Carlos Clugy-Soto. Currently St
 Andrew has no plans to search for a pastor, as attendance continues in the 12-20
 range. Through their lease of property as parking during the the refurbishment of
 the nearby high school, the church is able to meet their current operational needs.
- Preaching at Divine Savior was initially divided between two individuals in the congregation, but for the last several months, has been done by Rev. Debra Clugy-Soto, an ordained Disciples of Christ minister. They plan to engage her in a short term pulpit supply role until the current search process is completed. She or her husband, Carlos have officiated at communion there every month. Attendance at Divine Savior ranges from 30 to 50 people and the church has adequate funds to support a part time position.
- Jimmy Stevens and Lucretia Chew was appointed as liaisons with the congregation to develop a search for a part-time ordained minister/tentmaker. The search committee has completed its initial document, which now awaits approval by the session and then MMT. After that point, we will see what possibilities there are to obtain a part time bi-lingual pastor. Before that process begins, the Administrative Commission plans to meet to access the current status of both churches.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer for lunch at 12:00 p.m. The meeting was reconvened at 12:30 p.m. with prayer. Flynn Long was granted a moment of personal privilege.

Report of the Missional Networking Team

The report was presented by Jim Miles

I. Matters of Information

A. The team wants to encourage the presbytery to participate in the "How the Gospel

Impacts Power & Sexual Ethics" workshop planned for February 22nd at First Presbyterian Church, El Paso.

- B. The team received a qualitative report from the Next Steps Task Force.
- C. The team approved the recommendation from the Personnel Sub-Committee that the stipend for Stated Clerk, Kay Long be increased from \$12,000 to \$18,000 per year.

III. Recommendations Requiring More Careful Consideration

A. That the presbytery approve the following revisions to Section 4 of the Manual of Administrative Operations, and the adoption of a Standing Rule that will enable the presbytery to assume original jurisdiction of a session for the <u>limited purpose of judicial process in disciplinary cases</u> whenever a written request of a session is received.

It was MOVED AND CARRIED that Recommendation III.A be approved.

SECTION 4 TEAMS, TASK FORCES, COMMISSIONS AND SPECIAL COMMITTEES

4.1 AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY

Presbytery work between stated meetings shall be done by permanent or temporary teams, commissions elected by the presbytery, and any task forces appointed by the teams, or special committees appointed in accordance with the Rules of Discipline of the Book of Order.

4.2 MEMBERSHIP

Members of teams and commissions shall be elected by the presbytery or appointed by the moderator with the approval of the presbytery. Members of administrative commissions shall be composed of teaching and ruling elders in numbers as nearly equal as possible and sufficient to accomplish their work.

Teams may appoint members to permanent or temporary task forces in order to accomplish their tasks and goals. Task force members do not need to be members of the

team which appoints the task force.

Temporary teams may be appointed by the presbytery. Temporary committees may be appointed by the moderator.

Special Committees shall be created by the moderator, general missioner or stated clerk, and appointed by the moderator.

4.3 QUORUM

The quorum of any team, task force, or commission, or special committee shall be a majority of its members. The advisory personnel are not part of the quorum.

4.8 **RELATIONSHIPS**

Teams, commissions, and temporary, and special committees shall be directly accountable to the presbytery.

Task forces are accountable to the team responsible for their creation.

4.9 SPECIAL COMMITTEES

An Investigating Committee (IC) may shall be appointed in accordance with the Book of Order, whenever its existence is necessary to investigate a written statement of an alleged offense, filed under the auspices of the Disciplinary Chapters of the Book of Order (D-10.0201b). The Committee will consist of three to five members, and will be created by the moderator, general missioner, and stated clerk, and appointed by the moderator.

A Committee of Counsel shall be appointed in accordance with the Book of Order (D-6.0302a-b) whenever its existence is necessary. The committee will consist of no more than three persons shall—and will be appointed created by the moderator of presbytery, general missioner, and stated clerk, and appointed by the moderator. when necessary

Standing Rule:

When the Stated Clerk of the Presbytery receives a written request from the clerk of Session of a congregation requesting that the Presbytery take original jurisdiction of the Session for purposes of judicial process, the Presbytery may agree to assume original jurisdiction of that particular Session for the limited purpose of performing the functions of the Session required under the Rules of Discipline. The request should be from the Session and should include reasons for the request. The Session will reimburse the Presbytery for any costs of the inquiry if the Session is able. The Session may request a waiver of this cost requirement to the Presbytery. Upon

assumption of original jurisdiction of a Session for Judicial Process, the Presbytery will form an investigating committee according to its rule under D-10.0201b.

Report of the Missional Resource Team

Report was presented by Don Carlton

I. Matters of Information

A. The first call for the Builders Fellowship will be given to First Presbyterian Church, Fort Stockton to replace 60 and 70 year old windows in the two main buildings.

For those that are not familiar with the Builders Fellowship it was first conceived and put in place by Charlie Hollingsworth, our presbytery executive in 1980. It was his plan that interested and motivated Presbyterians within Tres Rios Presbytery would welcome the opportunity to contribute a relatively small amount of personal financial support to the "bricks and mortar" needs of churches other than their own when the need was real and vital to those churches service in the community. Over the past 37 years the Builders Fellowship has given over \$348,059 to 30 churches and 4 mission projects.

- B. The 2016 financial review for the presbytery was received and reviewed by the team. Copies of the review are available at the clerks table.
- C. Insurance policy for the presbytery was reviewed and renewed with the Insurance Man (GuideOne).

Report of the Missional Ministries Team

The report was presented by Tim Davenport-Herbst. Introduced Jen Fox (Candidate) and Hope Griffin (Inquirer).

I. Matters of Information

- A. Missional Ministries Team met November 6th, December 14th, and January 23, 2018.
- B. New officers elected for the year beginning in November 2017 are Tim Davenport-Herbst, Moderator and Jobeth McLeod, Clerk.
- C. MMT continues to supervise six inquirers and candidates under the care of presbytery in preparing for ministry. Those individuals are: Inquirers Donna Hedicke, Christi Brennan, and Hope Griffin; Candidates Suzanne Gulick, Lauren Heare Morris, and Jen Fox.
- D. MMT continues to work with various churches in the presbytery to provide support for ministry issues, pastoral searches, and changing ministries.
- E. Lewis Allen advised the presbytery of his plans to retire effective April 1, 2018.
- F. Craig Holstedt advised the presbytery of his plans to retire effective April 15, 2018.
- G. Rev. Kathryn Morton (HR) has requested transfer of her membership from Mission Presbytery to Tres Rios.
- H. The session of Grace Presbyterian Chapel, San Angelo requested permission to call a congregational meeting for the purpose of voting to extend the call to Rev. Kary Fry as Designated Pastor for an additional four (4) year term.

- I. The session of Grace Presbyterian Church, El Paso requested permission to call a congregational meeting for the purpose of voting to establish the position of Associate Pastor for Spiritual Nurture, and to authorize the Nominating Committee to nominate a slate of members to be elected and serve as the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC).
- J. The session of First Presbyterian Church, Sanderson requested permission to call a congregational meeting on November 5th for the purpose of voting on whether or not to enter into the discernment process in accordance with the presbytery's Reconciliation and Gracious Dismissal Policy.
- K. Report received of the First P.C., Sanderson congregational meeting advising that the congregation voted 14-0 to enter into the discernment process and set the required quorum. A Covenant Agreement was signed.
- L. MMT is developing plans for a one-day training event to instruct additional ruling elders approved for pulpit supply in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Interest in the revitalization of the presbytery's Commissioned Lay Pastor Academy is being explored, as well as, the possibility of synod sponsored CLP continuing education courses.
- M. Presbytery plans an educational event exploring "How the Gospel Impacts Power and Sexual Ethics" to be held Thursday, Feb. 22nd at First Presbyterian Church, El Paso. The Rev. Jan Edmiston, Co-Moderator of the 222nd General Assembly (PCUSA) will be the keynote speaker for the event.
- N. The Board of Pensions will hold a retirement planning seminar, "Growing into Tomorrow....Today", on March 1-2, 2018 at First Central Presbyterian, Abilene, TX.

A. Approved the recommendation that Inquirer Lauren Heare Morris (St. Paul, SA) be moved to the candidacy phase in the preparation for ministry process effective August 6, 2017.

- B. Approved the recommendation that Candidate Suzanne Gulick (First, Big Spring) be certified ready to receive a call and enter into conversations with potential churches effective August 6, 2017.
- C. Approved request of Candidate Jen Fox (Grace, El Paso) to transfer presbytery of care to Tres Rios from the Presbytery of San Francisco. Permission also granted to take the Worship & Sacrament ordination exam (eff. 12-14-17).
- D. Approved presbytery's 2018 Approved Pulpit Supply List.
- E. Approved that the following ruling elders be authorized to administer the Lord's Supper in 2018: Jim Blischke, Bernadette Coffee, Randy Farmer, Dennis Haralson, Ann Hurt, T. C. Kincaid, Tom Koger, Peggy Tharp, and Bea Torres.
- F. Granted permission for First Presbyterian Church, Odessa to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee for the position of pastor.
- G. Approved request that Lucretia Chew be appointed to serve as the presbytery's advisor to Jinny Forbes for the Christian Educator Certification Program.
- H. Approved permission for First Presbyterian Church, Sanderson to call a congregational meeting on November 5th for the purpose of voting on whether or not to enter into the discernment process in accordance with presbytery's policy.
- I. Appointed Gary Dill (First, Marfa), Cindy Duke (First, Pecos), Lynn Fowler (First, Pecos), and Nelson Sager (First, Alpine) to serve as presbytery's representatives for the First, Sanderson discernment process. Representatives for the church are Malone Mitchell, Scott Mitchell, Mark Nash-Ford and Ada Lee Robbins. Jobeth McLeod will serve as facilitator.
- J. Approved the request that presbytery concur with the dissolution of Craig Holstedt's call as pastor to First, Big Spring, effective April 15, 2018, pending the congregational vote on February 4th, and that he be granted Honorably Retired status.
- K. Approved the request that presbytery concur with the dissolution of Lewis Allen's call as pastor to Good Shepherd, Sonora, effective April 1, 2018, pending the

- congregational vote at a meeting to be held in the near future, and that he be granted Honorably Retired status.
- L. Granted permission for Lewis Allen to continue laboring out of bounds in Mission Presbytery as supply pastor at First Presbyterian Church, Rock Springs.
- M. Approved session request that Rev. Deborah Clugy-Soto (United Church of Christ) be authorized to serve as Temporary Supply Pastor for Divine Savior, El Paso for a six month period.
- N. Approved commissioning ruling elder Dennis Haralson (First, Seminole) to serve as moderator of the First, Coahoma session.
- O. Appointed Kary Fry to convene a sub-committee to examine Rev. Kathryn Morton (HR) for membership in the Presbytery of Tres Rios.
- P. Approved the request of the Grace Presbyterian Chapel's session to call a congregational meeting for the purpose of extending the call of Rev. Kary Fry as Designated Pastor for an additional four (4) year term.
- Q. Approved the request of Grace Presbyterian Church, El Paso session to call a congregational meeting for the purpose of establishing the position of Associate Pastor for Spiritual Nurture and authorize the Nominating Committee to propose a slate of members for election to serve as the APNC.

Tres Rios Next Steps Task Force Recommendation

February 23, 2018

The Next Steps Task Force, since the October 2017 meeting of Tres Rios Presbytery, met 7 times for half day meetings and participated in a retreat February 4-6 facilitated by Valerie Young of the Synod of the Sun. After much prayerful consideration and discussion we bring the following recommendation.

The Impact:

Tres Rios Presbytery partners with pastors and congregations so that all feel respected, encouraged and inspired.

This proposal is built upon the foundation of partnership. Why? So that all pastors and congregations feel respected, encouraged and inspired. We are partners. We work together and come alongside one another. We show respect for our shared Presbyterian tradition, heritage and form of government; for our diverse perspectives and ministry contexts; and simply for each other as brothers and sisters in Christ. We encourage one another not merely to feel good, but to build one another up, to demonstrate our care for one another, and to embolden each other in our ministry and witness. We inspire one another to move beyond ourselves, to see our communities and be empowered to serve and share the love of Jesus with those outside our churches.

Tres Rios Presbytery partners with pastors and congregations so that all feel respected, encouraged, and inspired. All our efforts should be filtered through this desired impact. How can we partner? Does it show respect? Does it encourage? Does it inspire?

The Plan:

1. Governed by three teams: The Administrative Team, the Pastoral Team, and the Vision and Outreach Team.

The Administrative Team partners with pastors and congregations to facilitate the business of the presbytery and ensure proper fulfillment of the Book of Order requirements.

The Pastoral Team partners with pastors and congregations to encourage spiritual growth and guidance.

The Vision and Outreach Team partners with pastors and congregations to inspire vision and service to the community.

Each of these teams will consist of 4 nominated and elected members: two clergy and two ruling elders, each representing one of the four clusters. Each will serve a two-year

term, with the exception of one clergy and one ruling elder from the first class who will serve a three year term.

The teams will function as commissions, having authority to make their own decisions and spend within their budget, with the exception of items that require a vote of the full presbytery.

Each team will have the power to create sub-committees and task forces as necessary.

Each team will participate in a "Team Meet" at least quarterly to report on their activity and decisions, presided over by the Moderator. This is not a decision-making body, but is intended to promote communication, transparency and collaboration among the teams.

Each team will be resourced by a part-time staff member and the full-time Administrative Assistant.

Job descriptions for the teams are attached as Appendix A, B and C.

2. Gathered two times per year as a presbytery.

One of these gatherings will be a one day worship and business meeting planned by the Administrative Team. The other gathering will be a "Big Event" to include a brief business meeting but primarily consist of an energetic, inspiring, equipping and/or mission-oriented event to be planned and organized alternately by the Pastoral Team and the Vision and Outreach team.

3. Resourced by three part-time and one full-time employee as follows:

Stated Clerk, paid part-time employee who resources the Administrative Team and fulfills the Book of Order duties of a Stated Clerk.

Pastoral Presbyter, paid part-time employee who resources the Pastoral Team.

Vision and Outreach Presbyter, paid part-time employee who resources the Vision and Outreach Team

Each of these positions could be filled by ordained clergy, ruling elders, or CREs and could be shared with a local congregation as a way of partnering with our churches who do not require or cannot afford a full-time pastor.

Job descriptions for the new positions of Pastoral Presbyter and Vision and Outreach Presbyter are attached as Appendix D and E.

The Means:

1. Implementation

Timeline:

February 2018 - Recommendation presented at Presbytery meeting and initial questions answered

March - June 2018

Next Steps members will meet with current teams of Presbytery and existing cluster events to further explain this recommendation and respond to questions and concerns.

Request the current Committee on Nominations and Representation to slate an Implementation Team who will oversee the necessary amendments to by-laws, provide for the hiring of new staff and nomination of members for all the teams, and address any other actions required to fully implement this recommendation in a timely manner.

Proposed amendments to this recommendation should be sent in writing to shannon.weisenfels@gmail.com before May 1, 2018. The Task Force will submit these amendments with recommendation for a yes or no vote to the Missional Networking Team for distribution to the presbytery prior to the June meeting.

June 2018 - Vote on the recommendation at Presbytery meeting. If the motion to adopt passes, elect the slated Implementation Team so they can begin work immediately.

January 2019 – New staff and structure in place.

If this recommendation is adopted, the task force further recommends the following:

- When hiring, build upon the foundation of partnership, by identifying congregations willing and able to support a pastor or CRE when shared with the Presbytery.
- Encourage cluster gatherings and get-to-know-you events 3-4 times a year, including during the implementation process, to build community and connection. The type of event is up to the cluster, but we encourage family-oriented activities where all the member churches can fully participate. We must know each other to truly be partners.
- Once implemented, Vision and Outreach Team will evaluate the progress annually by conducting a survey among a broad random sampling of the presbytery consisting of three True/False questions:

- 1. Do you feel respected by Tres Rios Presbytery?
- 2. Do you feel encouraged in your interactions with Tres Rios Presbytery?
- 3. Do you feel inspired by your connection with Tres Rios Presbytery?

Please explain/expand upon your answers.

The Vision and Outreach Team will recommend adjustments, changes and new vision as needed in response to this evaluation.

2. How do we provide the resources to fund the implementation?

The Rationale:

1. Why only four elected members of each team?

One of Next Steps' earliest agreed upon goals was that our presbytery should be administratively lean. Each team has the power to appoint sub-committees or task forces as needed. We hope that providing more short-term opportunities for people to serve on well-resourced teams will

actually involve more people in the presbytery in the long run. We also hope that by wiping the slate more or less clean in terms of responsibilities for the Pastoral Team and Vision and Outreach Team, we will only go forward with the events and projects that have a champion and energetic volunteers behind them.

2. Why three staff people?

We are required to have a Stated Clerk and most presbyteries now compensate their Stated Clerk, which is right given the many responsibilities of the position. It is our human tendency, however, to give priority to the tasks that are well-defined, staffed and funded. While our administrative functions are important and required, they are not necessarily the most important function of a presbytery. For this reason, we wanted to equally staff the three teams and three ministry areas of our presbytery so that all our functions become well-defined and funded, and thus are all prioritized.

We founded this recommendation on the idea of partnership. More staff, potentially living and working in different clusters, will enable more easily facilitated partnerships and connections between neighboring congregations.

3. Why spend so much money? Wasn't financial decline one of the reasons the Next Steps Task Force was formed?

Tres Rios actually has significant financial resources in the form of investments with the Texas Presbyterian Foundation. While we do anticipate a continuing decline in church contributions in the future, we want to put our financial and human resources into building a more vital partnership among our churches, building on our shared Presbyterian value of connectionalism. We are also recommending generating new income through the sale or rental of the presbytery office. We hope that embedding employees in our local congregations will help to foster the sense among our churches that "presbytery is me too." We're also encouraging saving travel expenses for volunteers by the use of Zoom for meetings when possible.

4. Do we really need to change?

Yes. The Church in the western hemisphere is weathering a significant cultural change, and we need to be better positioned to address it. All our churches, not only the smallest, need partners to move into the future fulfilling the Great Commission and discerning what it looks like to encourage and inspire our communities in this fast-moving 21st Century world. Many presbyteries across the nation are going through similar processes to address this broad reality as well as the commonly shared reality of fewer churches and the resulting decline in human and financial resources.

5. Does this recommendation go far enough? Is it enough change?

The Next Steps Task Force engaged in research and much discussion about more drastic options such as allowing our member churches to join neighboring presbyteries and merging with another presbytery. After evaluation, we felt that our churches going their separate ways, while definitely a new direction, did not address our key concern that presbytery partner with pastors

and congregations to respect, encourage and inspire. There was energy in our conversations about the potential of a merger with a neighboring presbytery, particularly Palo Duro. Merging is a long process and we want to do much more than just get by in the near future. We want to pour our energy and resources into strengthening our partnership. As we become more connected and encouraged by one another, we also become a more attractive potential partner. We built the annual evaluation of this new plan into the structure so that if we feel another next step is needed in the coming years, there is an already established team charged with assessing our needs and exploring that further next step.

Even year class: 1 clergy, 1 ruling elder Odd year class: 1 clergy, 1 ruling elder

The Administrative Team will maintain a standing Leadership Recruitment and Representation sub-team, 2 clergy and 2 ruling elders in 2 classes representative of each cluster, to nominate the 4 members of each team, the Moderator of Tres Rios Presbytery, the members of the Permanent Judicial Commission, and the new class of the Leadership Recruitment and Representation Team. They shall fulfill the nominating and representation functions required by the Book of Order.

The Administrative Team has the power to appoint sub-committees and task forces as deemed necessary.

The Administrative Team is resourced by the Stated Clerk and Administrative Assistant.

Mechanics:

The Administrative Team will serve as a commission, having authority to make its own decisions and spend within its budget, except for items requiring approval by the presbytery.

At first meeting of each new class, the Administrative Team will elect a team moderator and clerk.

The team clerk will provide minutes of all meetings to the Administrative Assistant and Stated Clerk for Presbytery packets, Team Meets, record keeping, website and any other shared communications.

Responsibilities:

The Administrative Team partners with pastors and congregations to facilitate the business of the presbytery and ensure proper fulfillment of the Book of Order requirements.

This includes:

- 1. All financial duties such as the budget and annual review
- 2. Matters concerning property and insurance
- 3. Maintain the Manual of Operations
- 4. Provide for necessary Personnel functions of the presbytery
- 5. In partnership with the Stated Clerk:
 - Records Review
 - Matters pertaining to General Assembly and Synod
 - Provide for the nomination of new team leadership and a moderator in collaboration with current team leadership
 - Resource the Permanent Judicial Commission, Administrative Commissions and any other judicial functions of the Presbytery
- 6. Provide for all matters pertaining to Pastoral Calls (receiving inquirers and candidates, annual consultations, examinations, ordinations and installations, etc.)
- 7. Plan the annual worship and business meeting
- 8. Plan the annual small business portion of the Tres Rios Big Event
- 9. Organize and participate in the Team Meet at least quarterly
