I. Matters of Information

REPRESENTATION AND METHOD OF NOMINATIONS as required by Synod of the Sun

Synod of the Sun requires each presbytery to provide a statement that a committee on representation exist, established by the presbytery's own rule and evidence of "procedures and mechanisms for promoting and reviewing the [presbytery's] implementation of the church's commitment to inclusiveness and representation" (G-3.0103).

The synod also requires that each presbytery have "A process for nominating persons to serve in positions requiring election by the presbytery that ensures the requirements of G-3.0111 (which reads: "The process shall ensure that nominations are made by an entity broadly representative of the constituency of the council, and in conformity with the church's commitment to unity in diversity.")

The MN&RT met on September 7 and September 14, 2017 to review Section 8 Missional Nominations and Representation Team of the Manual of Administrative Operations and to secure nominees for moderator, moderator elect, missional teams 2020 and any vacancies, Alternate General Assembly (GA) Commissioners plus a Young Adult Advisory Delegate (YAAD). Nominees were selected in compliance with the MN&RT Mission Statement: To promote the church's commitment to inclusiveness and representation in the nomination and election of persons to serve the presbytery, and to review and make recommendations to the presbytery for implementing these goals.

The representation and nomination process currently involves:

- review of the team's responsibilities toward inclusiveness and diversity, and the combined Annual Statistical Report for the presbytery's provided by PCUSA Research Services.
- 2. analysis of the positions to be filled and a determination made of how the full diversity of the presbytery can best be represented in nominating new persons.
- 3. sending nomination forms and gift/talent surveys to every church
- 4. soliciting and receiving self-nominations
- 5. assigning members of the MNRT to contact presbytery leaders, and pastors of churches in their clusters to solicit names for nomination
- 6. compiling a list of names and talents of those willing to serve either now or in the future
- 7. in-person and conference call meetings of the team to prioritize names, discuss gifts for service, decide who will contact and by when, retrieve contact information when candidate agrees to serve

Tres Rios Presbytery is blessed to have gifted people who desire to serve our presbytery and our Lord. Every effort was made to submit a slate that represents a variety of male and female, laypersons and teaching elders, and ethnic and geographical representation when elected to existing teams when possible.

TRES RIOS PRESBYTERY

Willie Hall Black/Barstow Presbyterian Women Scholarship Fund Trust Agreement

The Presbyterian Women of Tres Rios Presbytery hereby establish a Scholarship Fund Trust in the approximate amount of \$87,336.55 as of August 1, 2016. These funds are currently held under the name "Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery – Tres Rios." The funds are currently held with New Covenant Mutual Funds – Columbus, Ohio and Wells Fargo Bank. This scholarship fund will be administered by three Trustees from Tres Rios Presbytery according to the following guidelines:

- 1. This trust shall be funded by the whole amount plus accruing interest, and remain in the existing accounts with New Covenant Mutual Funds and Wells Fargo Bank until it can be invested in a separate, interest bearing banking or savings account, as directed by the Treasurer of Tres Rios Presbytery. These funds will be independently administered by elected Trustees from Tres Rios Presbytery in consultation with the Treasurer of Tres Rios Presbytery.
- 2. The maximum annual scholarship funds awarded may not exceed five percent (5%) of the total fund balance from the previous calendar year.
- 3. Initially three trustees will be recommended by the Presbyterian Women of Tres Rios Presbytery, and placed into classes for 2018, 2019, and 2020. Thereafter, one Trustee shall be elected each year to serve for a three year term. A trustee may serve for no more than two (2) terms or six (6) consecutive years. The subsequent nomination of Trustees shall originate from the existing Tres Rios Presbytery Nominating Committee, but also may be offered by a commissioner at a stated or called presbytery meeting. It is respectfully recommended that: (1) one member of the Black family is represented as a Trustee when possible, and (2) deference be given to Tres Rios Presbyterian women when electing subsequent Trustees.
- 4. Persons eligible to receive a scholarship from this Trust shall be:
 - Deserving theological seminary students with financial needs who are under the care of a congregation and the Missional Ministry Team of either Tres Rios or Palo Duro Presbyteries and enrolled in an approved Master of Divinity or Doctor of Ministry program;
 - b. Ruling Elders in training to become Commissioned Ruling Elders; and
 - c. Those members of presbytery that are registered in approved educational opportunities as deemed appropriate by the trustees as long as adequate funds are available. (Example: youth attending Triennium)
- 5. Any individual, congregation, or presbytery entity may make additional contributions to this scholarship fund trust. However, all accumulated funds and any interest earned will be consolidated, administered, and distributed according to the previously stated guidelines and/or bylaws hereafter adopted by the Trustees.
