The Presbytery of Tres Rios The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Virtual Meeting March 4, 2022

The 120th stated meeting of The Presbytery of Tres Rios, Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) was called to order with prayer by Moderator Bill Rose at 1:00 p.m. on Friday, March 4, 2022 via ZOOM Video Conference. As per our Bylaws, Article X (four ministers and four ruling elder commissioners from four different congregations), a quorum was declared present by Stated Clerk Kay Long. Meeting began with worship. The sermon was presented by Rev Cindy Carlisle. The presbytery celebrated the retirement of Rev. John Nelsen, Rev. Katherine Norvell and Rev. Cheryl Homsher. The new Recruitment and Representation Committee is composed this year of 2 ruling elders and 1 teaching elder (2 males and 1 female) representing the clusters, and a variety of ages.

Exhibit C

Commissioning Ruling Elders To Particular Pastoral Service

When the presbytery, in consultation with the session or other responsible committee, determines that its strategy for mission requires it, the presbytery may authorize a ruling elder to be commissioned to limited pastoral service as assigned by the presbytery. A ruling elder so designated may be commissioned to serve in a validated ministry of the presbytery. Presbytery, in its commission, may authorize the ruling elder to moderate the session of the congregation to which he or she is commissioned, to administer the Sacraments, and to officiate at marriage, where permitted by state law. This commission shall also specify the term of service, which shall not exceed three years but shall be renewable. The presbytery shall review the commission at least annually.

Regarding Clarifying the Intent of G-2.1001 on Use of Commissioned Pastors Commissioning Ruling Elders to Particular Service

Whereas the use of Commissioned Pastors (formerly called commissioned lay pastors and commissioned ruling elders) in ministry has become more common and more needed, especially in geographically large presbyteries; and

Whereas the commissioning of Commissioned Pastors (CPs) to service in multiple settings is common practice in presbyteries; and

Whereas the Synod of the Southwest Permanent Judicial Commission ruled in *Presbytery de Cristo vs. Loew* that presbyteries have the right to commission CPs to multiple settings; and

Whereas there remains conversation and controversy regarding what the Book of Order allows presbyteries to do regarding its commissioning of CPs to service in multiple settings.

Therefore, an amendment to G-2.1001 is needed to clarify the language and specify that presbyteries may, if they determine that its strategy for mission requires it, commission CPs to service in multiple settings.

Strikethrough text are deletions; red text are additions:

G-2.1001 Functions

When the presbytery, in consultation with a session or different sessions, determines that its strategy for mission requires it, the presbytery may authorize a ruling elder to be commissioned to limited pastoral service as a "CP or Commissioned Pastor" as assigned by the presbytery. A ruling elder so designated may be commissioned to serve in one or more validated ministries a validated ministry of the presbytery concluding service to the Presbytery. Presbytery, in its commission, may authorize the ruling elder to moderate the session of the congregation or congregations to which he or she is commissioned, to administer the Sacraments, and to officiate at marriages where permitted by state law. In geographically large presbyteries with hard-to-reach churches or hard to fill ministry assignments, a Commissioned Pastor may be assigned on behalf of the presbytery to any validated ministry as presbytery needs arise. This commission shall also specify the term of service, which shall not exceed three years but shall be renewable. The presbytery shall review the commission at least annually. A Commissioned ruling elder may be authorized to one long term agreement or serve the entire presbytery in multiple assignments and a one-time event.

1. MISSION STATEMENT

We believe with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength that God has called us to unify in order to be the best church we can be within our congregation and in the greater community. We will move forward focused on all we have in common, with an emphasis on the gifts we bring to each other and the leading of the Holy Spirit.

We agree that:

- God is the maker of heaven and earth and calls us to love and worship God first and foremost.
- · Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God, and we proclaim him Lord and Savior of the world.
- · God has given us all gifts for service.
- God calls us to love one another.

In that love, God calls us to be a unified community. We are a community of faith that:

- · Grows together in faith
- · Respects individual differences
- Reconciles our difficulties and disagreements
- Testifies to God's love and care
- · Cares for the hurting
- · Has compassion for the poor
- Invests our time and money in mission (locally and globally)

How are we doing this already? This is what we do, but not all we do!

- Relevant worship
- Educational and ministry opportunities for all ages
- Have a facility/space to do God's work and welcome others
- Sunday School, Bible classes
- · Church on Wednesdays
- · Children and youth activities
- Music ministry
- Vacation Bible/Church School
- · Evangelism and outreach in the community
- Intentional fellowship activities to build relationships
- Mission at home and abroad
- · Provide for those in need
- Denominational partners

We believe that we are better together; that our similarities overcome our differences; and with Jesus as our center, all things are possible.

2. NAME

A Unified Christian Ministry of First Christian Church and Grace Presbyterian Chapel (PCUSA), of San Angelo, Texas (hereafter in this document to be called UCM)

3. IDENTITY

Each denomination in the UCM will retain its relationship to its denominational body to which it belongs and/or reports. Each denominational governing body may meet as deemed necessary to transact any business for the welfare of its denomination and to oversee its budget and its financial obligation to UCM.

4. WORSHIP

FCC and GPC shall gather weekly on Sundays for proclamation and exposition of the Word and celebrate the Sacraments. The Parish Council shall consult with the Senior Minister and the worship committee to oversee and approve all public worship in the life of the church and to determine both regular and special occasions.

5. SUNDAY SCHOOL

The Sunday School shall be administered by the Christian Education Committee of UCM. Designated hours of Sunday School shall be determined by the Parish Council in consultation with the Christian Education Committee and Senior Minister.

6. COMMUNION

The Lord's Supper/Communion/Eucharist (the Table) shall be observed every Sunday and at other worship gatherings when appropriate.

Jesus alone issues the invitation to the Table where all are welcome, regardless of denominational affiliation. We also recognize that children were encouraged to come to the side of Jesus and allow parents to decide if their children can participate in Communion before being baptized.

7. BAPTISM

While we believe that the sacrament of baptism is received only once, any individual shall be baptized by immersion, sprinkling, or pouring, after consultation with the Pastor and their denominational affiliation. The Pastor may, as he/she chooses, secure the services of a commissioned/ordained minister to administer the sacrament of baptism.

8. MEMBERSHIP

Participants of UCM will retain membership to their individual congregations but support the ministry of UCM.

Membership as described above may be accomplished by any of the three ways: baptism, profession/reaffirmation of faith, or transfer of membership. Open membership shall be practiced for those wishing to transfer from another denomination having been baptized with the water in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, regardless of method of baptism. Any differences regarding denominational practices may be discussed with the ministerial staff.

Individuals may hold membership in FCC, GPC, both FCC and GPC, or the UCM

All persons who are part of the life of FCC and GPC are invited to participate and serve within the shared ministries. A faithful member bears witness to God's love and grace and promises to be involved responsibly in the ministry of Christ's Church.

Such involvement includes:

- proclaiming the good news in Word and deed
- taking part in the life and worship of the congregation
- lifting one another up in prayer, mutual concern, and active support
- studying Scripture and its issues of Christian faith and life
- supporting the ministry of the church through the giving of money, time, and talents
- demonstrating a new quality of life within and through the church
- responding to God's activity in the world through service to others

- living responsibly in personal faith, in one's vocational, political, cultural, and social relationships of life
- working in the world for peace, justice, freedom, and human fulfillment,
- caring for God's creation
- participating in the governing responsibilities of the church
- reviewing and regularly evaluating the integrity of one's membership and considering ways in which one's participation in worship and service of the church may be increased and made more meaningful.

9. DENOMINATIONAL BODIES

Each church will retain its own governing body to conduct denominational business in accordance with FCC Constitution and Bylaws and the PCUSA Book of Order.

10. PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council shall oversee the shared ministry of UCM and be composed of 9 members.

The 9 members are: President, Secretary, Treasurer, 6 at large members made up of leadership from the FCC Church Board and GPC Session.

Members will serve a staggered three-year term and may not be elected for subsequent terms until 1 year after their term of service. The Parish Council must include a minimum of 3 members from FCC and 3 members from GPC.

The Parish Council will meet monthly with clergy representatives at all the meetings. A quorum of 7 members is required to conduct official business. All Parish Council members have full voting privileges.

11. CHURCH DEPARTMENTS

The task of administering the ministries and missions of the church shall be delegated to the following functional departments; however, the duties, titles, policies, and membership of departments may be changed from year to year, as the Parish Council deems necessary. The Nominating Committee shall appoint department chairs, who shall be selected from the membership of FCC and/or GPC and attend monthly Parish Council meetings.

The departments of the church shall be:

- 1. Education
- 2. Outreach
- 3. Nurture
- 4. Property
- 5. Stewardship
- 6. Worship
- 7. Children/Youth

The members of the departments shall be selected by the chairs of the respective departments, in consultation with the ministers. Each department shall organize functional subcommittees to carry on the programs of the department.

Each department shall organize itself to conduct the business for which it is responsible and plan its general program that shall be presented to the Parish Council. Upon approval of the Parish Council, the department shall proceed to administer its programs in cooperation with other departments.

The purpose and duties of the Departments are as follows:

Education

- It shall be responsible for planning and administering the total adult educational program of the church, including Sunday school, leadership education, distribution of Christian literature, and enriching Christian family life.

Outreach

- It shall be responsible for:
 - Planning and promoting a definite program for mission education in every department of the church
 - Recommending the UCM's annual mission and benevolent budget
 - Caring for local benevolent needs not otherwise met
 - Sponsoring inter-denominational activities and church projects for social action
 - Promoting church conventions, conferences, assemblies, and retreats
 - Assisting in any other inter-church activity or community project.

Nurture

- It shall be the purpose of this department to maintain the closest possible contactwith the entire church membership to the end that each member may function effectively in the life of the church and to develop a spirit of comradeship and love within the congregation founded on a common love for Christ.
- It shall be responsible for providing an adequate program of social life for the church; supplying receptionists to welcome attendants at regular services; and giving publicity to church life and activities.

Property

- It shall maintain all church-owned property and equipment in proper condition.
- It shall supervise the condition and care of church grounds.
- It shall study needs and make recommendations for improvements.
- In cooperation with the Trustees, it shall provide adequate insurance againstpossible loss or damage.

Stewardship

- Work along the pastor and Parish Council to oversee the annual In His Steps Campaign

Worship

- It shall be responsible for the public worship of the church, the administration of baptism and the Lord's Supper, music, ushering, special services, and the encouragement of the devotional life among the individual members of the church.

Children/Youth

- It shall be responsible for carrying out the objectives of children and youth ministries by encouraging the personal and spiritual growth of youth and children; by providing them opportunities for Christian fellowship, education, service, and worship and by providing guidance and support to parents and sponsors of youth.

- It shall be responsible for planning and administering the total child/youth educational program of the church.

12. NOMINATING COMMITTEE

The Nominating Committee of FCC and GPC will be responsible for filling positions that are needed to meet the Constitution and Bylaws and Book of Order requirements. This includes positions such as: board members, session members, elders, deacons, and trustees. This work will be done independently of the UCM and must be done in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws and Book of Order.

The UCM Nominating Committee will be made up of the FCC and GPC Nominating Committee in accordance with FCC and GPC Constitution and Bylaws and/or Book of Order. The UCM Nominating Committee will make recommendations to fill expired terms and must be approved by each congregation at its annual congregational meeting to be held before December 31st. Any midterm vacancies will be filled by recommendations of the UCM Nominating Committee and approved by the Parish Council.

13. BUDGET AND TREASURER RESPONSIBILITIES

The Parish Council should appoint a Budget Committee of three to five church members and must include the treasurer of the Board and Session. The Budget Committee will prepare a budget to be approved by the Parish Council and the congregation before December 31st. Prior to the congregational vote, the proposed budget should be made available to all members electronically and/or by mail. A budget shall be developed with the direction of the Parish Council Treasurer and the Budget Committee and be presented to the Parish Council no later than its regular scheduled October Parish Council meeting.

The Parish Council Treasurer's responsibility shall be to:

- maintain a clear understanding of operation expenses of the church and give monthly financial reports to the Parish Council
- work closely with the treasurer of FCC and GPC to prepare and present a proposed budget to the Parish Council
- assist the pastoral leadership to oversee the annual In His Steps campaign
- chair the annual Budget Committee.

The Board and Session will call any necessary meetings, in accordance with its governing documents, to approve a budget prior to the UCM congregational meeting.

FCC and GPC financial responsibilities are to:

- maintain a church treasurer according to denominational requirements
- meet the UCM's financial obligation based on approved annual budget
- pick up weekly offerings, arrangements, and make any bank deposits in accordance with each churches governing bodies.
- The Treasurer of the Board and Session serve on the Parish Council Budget Committee

14. STAFFING STRUCTURE

The Senior Minister shall be in good and regular standing with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) or the Presbyterian Church USA and shall receive 3/4 votes of all members present and voting at a congregational meeting for his/her election.

The Senior Minister is responsible to the Parish Council. The Senior Minister shall work closely with the Parish Council and Personnel Committee to cunduct business of the church and serve as head of staff.

General duties and responsibilities shall be outlined in the Senior Minister's letter of call.

See addendum (page 8) for process for preparation, formation, election & duties of Pastoral Search Committee for a pastor or associate pastor.

Ministers shall be in good and regular standing with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) or the Presbyterian Church USA and shall receive 3/4 votes of all members present and voting at a congregational meeting for his/her election.

Associate Ministers are responsible to the Senior Minister and are expected to work closely with the Parish Council and Department Chair that falls under the individual's scope of work. General duties and responsibilities shall be outlined in the Associate Minister's letter of call.

In good faith we seek to have a balance of Disciple and Presbyterian clergy on staff when at all possible.

Support staff shall be hired by the Personnel Committee and approved by the Parish Council.

15. PERSONNEL COMMITTEE

The Parish Council shall appoint a standing personnel committee composed of the six members, two of whom shall be new in any year. The terms of office shall be for three years, not eligible to reappointment without the lapse of one year. The Personnel Committee must be made of no less than two members of FCC, two members of GPC and one member of the Parish Council.

Appointment of the personnel committee shall be ratified by a majority vote of the Parish Council.

The Personnel Committee shall have responsibility for employing or dismissing staff personnel in consultation with the senior minister, except clergy. It shall further be responsible for approving all salaries and wages, subject to the amounts approved through the annual budget. Any salary and wage that exceeds the amount approved in the budget shall be brought to the Parish Council for approval.

Dissolution of pastoral care of clergy should be done based on the requirement of his or her denominational affiliation.

16. SPECIAL COMMITTEES

The Parish Council shall appoint any special committees that may be deemed necessary.

17. CONGREGATIONAL MEETINGS

Annual Business Meeting: UCM shall hold an annual business meeting for the election of the Parish Council and other leadership positions. FCC and GPC will meet annually, according to FCC Constitution and Bylaws and the PCUSA Book of Order.

Budget Meeting: A regular business meeting of the congregation, which may coincide with the annual business meeting, shall be held prior to the beginning of each calendar year of the church to ratify the church budget and approve the terms of pastoral call.

Voting Privileges: Voting privileges shall be accorded to all members of FCC, GPC and UCM present at annual and regular business meetings of the congregation.

Notice of Meetings: Notice of all regular or special congregational meetings shall be posted on the Church's social media, announced at the regular Sunday morning worship services of the congregation at least two weeks in advance of the meeting and by means of the church newsletter or written notice sent through the mail. The purpose, date, time, and place of the meeting shall be indicated in each notice.

18. AMENDMENT TO THIS UNIFIED CHRISTIAN MINISTRY DOCUMENT

This document may be amended by 3/4 vote of the Parish Council at a scheduled or called meeting provided that a notice of the proposed amendment(s) has been posted and delivered to the Board and Session at least 30 days in advance of the meeting. Furthermore, all changes must be approved by the congregation of FCC and GPC and with the guidance of the Christian Church of the Southwest Region and the approval of the Presbytery of Tres Rios.

This document shall be reviewed annually by the Parish Council.

19. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE UNIFIED CHRISTIAN MINISTRY DOCUMENT

This document shall become effective upon approval by the Board of First Christian Church and Session of Grace Presbyterian Chapel and at each congregation called congregational meetings with 3/4 approval and in conversation with the Christian Church of the Southwest Region and approval of the Presbytery of Tres Rios

20. WITHDRAW FROM THE UNIFIED CHRISTIAN MINISTRY AND JOINT WITTNESS

The Unified Christian Ministry shall be dissolved by 3/4 vote from dissolution by either denomination at two joint congregational meetings, held no less than one month and no more than four months apart. The congregation seeking to dissolve the Unified Christian Ministry must seek blessing and/or approval from the Regional Office or Presbytery of Tres Rios

21. A LIVING DOCUMENT

This document of understanding for UCM is a "living" document and as outlined above, the Parish Council will update this document as they better understand how God is inviting FCC and GPC to share in ministry.

Furthermore, we understand this document is lacking several items, including responsibilities for elders and deacons, trustees, and other leadership. The Parish Council is tasked with the responsibility to make recommendations to the congregation on all missing items.

ADDENDUM

1. PROCESS FOR PREPARATION, FORMATION, ELECTION, & DUTIES OF A PASTORAL SEARCH COMMITTEE FOR A PASTOR OR ASSOCIATE PASTOR

Notification

The Christian Church of the Southwest Region and the Presbytery of Tres Rios Administration Team shall be notified immediately. Meetings shall be scheduled with representatives of both denominations to determine current practices and procedures for a Pastoral Search Committee.

Preparation

Consistent with the requirements and/or recommendations of the Region and Presbytery, a preparatory study and tasks may be done to prepare for the election of the Pastoral Search Committee.

Election

The Pastoral Search Committee shall consist of a minimum of three (3) members from each congregation and, if possible, an equal number of members from FCC and GPC. The Pastoral Search Committee shall be nominated by the UCM Nominating Committee and elected by the congregations at a called meeting of the congregation. At the first meeting of the Pastoral Search Committee, the members shall choose a Chairperson and Secretary. The Secretary shall record the minutes of regular and called meetings and make copies available to the Region and Presbytery. All expenses incurred by the Pastoral Search Committee shall be paid by the UCM.

Terms of Call

Terms of call to be negotiated with Region, Presbytery, Candidate and Search Committee to include Salary and Benefits that meet or exceed each denominations minimum requirements.

Pastoral Leadership

The Pastor shall maintain his/her ministerial credentials and relationship with his/ her parent denomination but shall be recognized and accredited by the denominational partner.

The Pastor shall be expected to attend various denominational meetings and assemblies (as schedule permits) as stated in Job Description of the Parish Pastor in order to identify with both denominations. The Parish shall provide expense money for the Pastor to attend denominational meetings. It is understood the money is in addition to his/her salary.

Three (3) members of the Pastoral Search Committee shall serve as the Pastoral Relations Committee for a term of two (2) years after the effective date of call.

The Pastoral Relations Committee shall meet with the Pastor as needed.

The Parish Council shall be the Pastor's advisory group. If the Pastor encounters difficulties or tensions or feels the need of counsel, he/she shall use the Parish Council as his/her advisor. After two {2) years, The Parish Council assumes the role of Pastoral Relations Committee.

In the event, after prayerful deliberation by the parties, it is the recommendation of the Parish Council or the Pastor that the pastoral relationship between the Pastor and the Parish be dissolved then consultation with the appropriate governing bodies of each denomination shall occur. Dissolution shall be according to the procedures of the Pastor's respective denomination and be consistent with the Terms of Call.

2.SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL CALLED MEETINGS

A special congregational meeting may be called for a congregation vote on any action of the Parish Council by presenting a petition to the President requesting a special meeting be called for such purpose. The petition shall be signed by no less than 25 members of the UCM to be valid.

Furthermore, the FCC Church Board or GPC Session can petition to meet with the Parish Council or call a special congregational meeting, after first meeting with the Parish Council, to vote on any action of the Parish Council with the notice as outlined in the UCM document.

All items shall receive 3/4 votes of all members present and voting at a congregational meeting.

3.JOINT MEMBERSHIP

The UCM will seek to make membership accessible for all people who are seeking to be in a relationship with the UCM but do not or cannot choose a single church to hold membership in. Members may hold joint membership and must be received into joint membership in accordance with the FCC Constitution and Bylaws and the PCUSA Book of Order.

People who wish to join the UCM but choose not to have a denomination affiliation may join as a member of the UCM. The Parish Council will work on membership requirements of the UCM, with the help of the Christian Church of the Southwest Region and the Presbytery of Tres Rios Administration Team, as FCC and GPC better understand how God spirit is moving and inviting FCC and GPC to live out a joint witness.
